





The person who checks your ears at the hearing clinic is an audiologist. They know all about ears, so you're in safe hands!

Or you could write or draw the thing you enjoyed most about your visit to the audiologist.










After these checks, the audiologist will write down the sounds you heard on a chart called an audiogram.
